ABOUT THE COUNTY PROCUREMENT OFFICE

The County Procurement Office (CPO) is a division of the County Executive Office. The County's purchasing operations are decentralized, granting delegated authority to each County department. Each department is responsible for acquiring goods and services to meet their business and operational needs.

As the corporate office for procurement services, CPO maintains the Contract Policy Manual, issues Countywide contracts known as Regional Cooperative Agreements (RCAs), implements and enforces Board policies and establishes procedures. CPO also provides oversight and consulting support services to all County departments.

CPO is committed to ensuring a fair, ethical and competitive procurement process.

PICK OC REQUIREMENTS

OCLSB REQUIREMENTS

1. Local Business Requirements

- Maintains their principal center of operations (i.e. headquarters) within Orange County, AND;
- Has a business located in Orange County that is not a post office box.

-OR-

Has a valid business license or certificate of occupancy issued by the County of Orange or by an Orange County city, or other documentation acceptable to the County of Orange.

2. Small Business (SB) Requirements

- Must be certified as a Small Business by the State of California Department of General Services (DGS).

3. OCLSB requirements above must be valid at the time of bid/proposal submittal.

DVBE REQUIREMENTS

1. Must be certified as a Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise by the State of California Department of General Services (DGS).

2. DGS DVBE requirements above must be valid at the time of bid/proposal submittal.

PICK OC CERTIFICATION

GETTING CERTIFIED AS AN OCLSB OR DVBE IS SIMPLE AND FREE

Sign up to receive every advantage available to your business. It's simple, and there are no costs involved.

- OCLSB or DVBE certification must be active at IFB or RFP closing date and must remain valid at time of contract award.
- The OCLSB or DVBE preference is given only to those who qualify, however, all vendors are encouraged to compete in the solicitation bid process.
- The solicitation and evaluation process established by Orange County remains unaltered while applying for OCLSB or DVBE certification.

OCLSB AND DVBE BENEFITS

Invitation for Bid (IFB)

- When the lowest bidder is a non OCLSB or non DVBE, the sole lowest certified OCLSB or DVBE within 5% of the lowest bid shall be given the opportunity to price match.
- The lowest certified OCLSB or DVBE must accept the County's offer to price match within 3 business days from the County's offer, unless otherwise specified by the County.
- If two or more OCLSBs or DVBEs have tied bids within the 5%, the County shall request best and final bids from each OCLSB or DVBE, which shall price match the lowest bid or better. If the best and final bids are tied, the County shall determine the contract award based on the County's best interest.

Request for Proposal (RFP)

- An extra 5% shall be applied to the tallied score of each certified OCLSB or DVBE to obtain the final score. If the final score of any OCLSB or DVBE matches the final score of a non OCLSB or non DVBE, preference shall be given to the certified OCLSB or DVBE.
- If two or more OCLSBs or DVBEs have the same final score, the County shall determine the contract award based on the County's best interest.

Businesses Certified as both OCLSB and DVBE

- If a State-certified OCLSB is also a State-certified DVBE, the preference given to that business shall be 8% instead of 5%. The separate OCLSB/DVBE preferences shall not be applied.

EXCEPTIONS

PICK OC does not apply where prohibited by law or regulation and including, but not limited to:

- Specific state or federally funded projects
- Cooperative contracts
- Sole Source contracts
- Emergencies
